Important Dates for Grade 12s:

June 5--payment of all school fees and a passing grade of minimum 50% in courses needed for diploma is required to participate in Commencement (not required for Grand Parade participation). Also the deadline to have marks up-to-date to choose the Valedictorian and Honors Grads. June 8th is when we will take a look at marks and fees and determine grad eligibility.

June 10-12 (we hope)--caps, gowns and diploma folders will be distributed to grade 12s (still waiting for grad cap tassels to come in) <u>We will send out an email to grads and post on FB when they are ready</u>

June 10--Google form will be emailed to student emails to collect information to be read when students cross the stage--please fill out by **June 15**

June 10--deadline to email childhood photo to heather.rogers@wrsd.ca to be used in the ceremony/parade slideshow

June 15--submit photo of grad with cap and gown to heather.rogers@wrsd.ca to be shared with local media (assuming we can hand out the cap and gowns in time)
